# Q&A: TNT CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping

TNT offers a range of CO<sub>2</sub> Services that help customers proactively address the environmental impact their business makes. These services equip customers with knowledge and allow them to take action.

With TNT's CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping customers can ship goods in a way that fully offsets any CO<sub>2</sub> emissions and mitigate the CO<sub>2</sub> impact of their shipments.

# 1. How are CO<sub>2</sub> emissions of TNT's customers' consignments compensated?

- As a first step CO<sub>2</sub> emissions caused by the transportation of the customers' consignments are calculated.
- As a second step these emissions are compensated or offset with an equivalent amount
  of CO<sub>2</sub> credits. CO<sub>2</sub> credits are verified reductions in CO<sub>2</sub> emissions that have been
  generated by CO<sub>2</sub> reduction projects elsewhere (e.g. wind power).
- As a results the CO<sub>2</sub> emissions caused by the transportation of the customers' consignments are equalised, and the shipments become CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral.

#### 2. Does TNT follow a standard for the calculation of CO<sub>2</sub> emissions?

- Yes. The methodology for calculating CO<sub>2</sub> emissions is fully compliant with the European Norm EN16258.
- TNT received external certification against EN16258 from SGS. The latest certification has been done in July 2014.

### 3. What type of CO<sub>2</sub> credits does TNT use to compensate CO<sub>2</sub> emissions?

- TNT exclusively uses the highest quality 'gold standard' Verified Emission Reductions (VERs).
- Additional specifications of credits:
  - Project type: wind power projects (renewable energy)
  - Year of credit generation (vintage): 2 years before compensation

#### 4. What does the 'Gold Standard' stand for?

- The Gold Standard is a certification standard for carbon mitigation projects, recognised internationally as the benchmark for quality in both the compliance and voluntary carbon markets.
- The Gold Standard is the standard of choice for multiple governments, multinationals and the United Nations and the only certification standard trusted and endorsed by more than 80 NGOs worldwide.

#### 5. Does TNT provide proof that the CO<sub>2</sub> emissions have actually been compensated?

- Yes, customers who sign up for the TNT CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping service receive a yearly certificate specifying the amount of CO<sub>2</sub> that TNT neutralised on their behalf
- This certificate also provides details of the 'Gold Standard' project(s) that generated the CO<sub>2</sub> credits that have been used for compensation.
- The 'Gold Standard Registry Public View' can be consulted (available through <u>www.goldstandard.org</u>) to confirm that these credits have actually been used ('retired') by TNT.

#### 6. Is TNT externally verified for the CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping service?

- Yes. TNT received external certification on CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping from SGS.
- The latest certification is from 16 December 2014. The SGS certification statement is made available on www.tnt.com/corporate/co2services

#### 7. Where can I find more information on the projects that generated the $CO_2$ credits?

- A summary of the project(s) used to compensate CO<sub>2</sub> emissions will be made available on <u>www.tnt.com/corporate/co2services</u> on a yearly basis (Quarter 1).

# 8. How can customers demonstrate their commitment to CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping?

- TNT has developed the 'Shipped CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral with TNT' logo which can be provided electronically in various formats.
- Customers who signed up for the CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping service can use the logo in their communication materials (e.g. website, brochures, etc.).

# 9. What are the conditions for TNT's CO<sub>2</sub> Neutral shipping service?

- In 2015 TNT will roll out its upgraded CO<sub>2</sub> services in large European countries.
