Shipments with a proper cone or clear **Non Stackable** label* are considered Non-Stackable.

*Other labels, such as fragile stickers are considered stackable



Top is not flat and/or not level

- A pallet which contains shipments with different heights, where the top is not flat is considered Non-Stackable
- A pallet must have a flat top which is level that makes the shipment resistant, compact and stackable





Top is not stable enough to support stacking

- The top surface should be able to support a EURO1 pallet
- The top surface should be able to have a EURO1 pallet be stacked upon in a stable manner (including where the top surface is smaller than the size of a EURO1 pallet)





Top surface cannot withstand stacking

- Check manually if the surface can withstand stacking by carefully applying pressure on top
- In case of doubt, the shipment will be considered as <u>Stackable</u>



Non palletised shipments which cannot be put in a cage

<u>Single</u> non palletised shipments, which cannot be put in a cage, are considered stackable.

In case of <u>multiple pieces</u>, a stackable pallet must be made by securing cylinders, pipes or rolls to a pallet.
